

# **Section 2 - Key Theological Plots**


Place yourself on the following theological plots. Identify what a person one step to the left and one step to the right would view differently than you.

### **CONSERVATIVE VS. PROGRESSIVE**




# HIGH CHURCH VS. LOW CHURCH

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# **Using this Survey**

The entire purpose of this survey is to provide a meaningful way to discuss several important aspects of theology. Two or more people who have each taken this survey should be able to fairly easily identify some of their unique theological differences. Let's explore what differences in each section would indicate.

# SECTION 1 (ORTHODOXY) - PART 1

This part looks at beliefs that have consistently been viewed as orthodox Christian beliefs. These statements are purposely worded in such a way that every different type of Christian could place a four and affirm total orthodoxy. Any one of these that is answered differently would be a good jumping off point for further discussion. Good questions would be "How would you reword the statement, changing the least amount possible, to be able to truthfully give it a four?"

# SECTION 1 (ORTHODOXY) - PART 2

This part looks at several issues that have strong traditional views, yet have come under more scrutiny recently (post enlightenment).

# SECTION 1 (ORTHODOXY) - PART 3

This section gives room for someone to identify other views they believe constitute an issue of orthodoxy. Anything in this box would be an interesting point of discussion. Some Christian groups have historically attempted to shrink the boundaries of what a true Christian is. They might have dozens more things they consider essential beliefs. Other types of Christians might say things like "Do you believe in Jesus? Then you're a Christian." This type would be highly uncomfortable with this whole process. These respective types of Christians have truly foundational differences that change the way they see almost everything within Christianity.

### **SECTION 2 (PLOTTING)**

These three plots may represent the most substantial differentiating lines within the Christian church. Each one of these issues is "secondary" in nature. What this means is that while they likely are not issues of Christian orthodoxy, they are deeply important issues that may render two believers "at odds" with one another. A church that has decent clarity on these plots and members with moderately unified groupings will be able to "labor in the kingdom" well together.

# **SECTION 3 (PRACTICAL THEOLOGY)**

This section is meant to evaluate the way that a person sees the world. Again, a group of people that largely see the world in ways *that are not incompatible with one another* will be able to "labor in the kingdom" well together. For example, if one person sees the aborting of healthy unborn lives as the biggest injustice and another sees the restriction of those abortions as the biggest injustice, we must contend with the fact that these two lenses are utterly incompatible with one another.
